Driving Directions

From I-235 Eastbound—Exit the interstate at 7th Street. Drive across 7th Street (one-way Southbound) to 6th Avenue (one-way Northbound). Turn left (north). Mercy is three blocks ahead on your right-hand side.

From I-235 Westbound—Exit the interstate at the sign that states 2nd, 3rd, and 5th Street exits. Follow the exit ramp straight ahead to the stoplights at 6th Avenue. Turn right and Mercy will be two blocks ahead on your right-hand side.

The Process, The Issues, The Outcomes

Presenter: Steven Mitchell, Region & Representative, Office for Civil Rights

This session will educate participants on recent changes in the Privacy Rule, recurrent issues he sees in complaints that his office investigates, and suggestions on how to respond to Privacy Rule complaint investigations. Participants gain an understanding of:

- The Privacy Rule
- Current issues in Privacy Rule enforcement
- How to respond when a Privacy Rule complaint is lodged against a covered entity

Steven Mitchell is a native of Kansas City, Missouri. He graduated from the University of Missouri with a law degree in 1984. He maintained a private practice of law with a significant health law component, until 1997, when he joined the Missouri Department of Social Services as a managing attorney regulating nursing homes and Medicaid rates. He has also worked as a consumer fraud attorney in the Missouri Attorney General's office, and as the managing attorney in the Kansas City office of Missouri Protection and Advocacy Services, before joining the US Department of Health and Human Services, Office for Civil Rights, in 2003. Mr. Mitchell is a Supervisory Equal Opportunity Specialist with OCR, and he leads a team of investigators responding to non-discrimination and Privacy Rule complaints.

Under his direction, Palm Beach Obstetrics & Gynecology started its transition to Electronic Health records four years ago. In recognition for their efforts, the practice was the recipient of the 2008 Davies Award honoring excellence in the implementation of electronic health records. The award, sponsored by the Healthcare Information and Management Systems Society (HIMSS) is given to practices that successfully use electronic means to improve healthcare delivery. It is considered the most prestigious health information technology award in the industry.

Iowa's New Resource: The Health IT Regional Extension Center

Presenter: Susan Harr, MPH, CPHIMS, Iowa Foundation for Medical Care (IFMC)

IFMC was recently designated as Iowa's Health Information Technology Regional Extension Center. As a HIT Regional Center, IFMC will assist providers in adopting, implementing and achieving meaningful use with their electronic health record systems. This includes technical assistance to 1,200 primary care providers in vendor selection, group purchasing, implementation, project management, practice workflow redesign, interoperability, health information exchange, and privacy and security best practices. This session covers the current status of Iowa HIT Regional Center operations and how Iowa providers can sign up to use the services provided by the Center. Participants will:

- Discuss the impact the of the HIT Regional Extension Center in Iowa.
- Understand the objectives of the meaningful use criteria for EHRs.
- Learn the requirements of priority primary care providers and the mechanism to apply for the program
- Understand how to avail them selves of the Extension Center and ways it will improve patient care.

Susan Harr is Program Director at the Iowa Foundation for Medical Care (IFMC) in West Des Moines. In this role she leads the Regional HIT Extension Center, a statewide resource center that provides technical assistance for physician office implementation of Electronic Health Records (EHRs). She is involved in a number of other HIT initiatives, including the Iowa e-Health Project to develop a statewide health information exchange (HIE) system. Prior to her work with IFMC, Susan was a Project Manager for Kaiser Permanente Medical Group in northern California. She holds a Masters in Health Services Administration from UCLA and an undergraduate Business degree.
